In short

My main areas of research expertise are Corpus Linguistics , Discourse Studies, and Cognitive Linguistics. My principal research interests concern both academic and non-academic application of Linguistics disciplines, in particular Corpus and Cognitive Linguistics approaches. For this purpose I have worked in various interdisciplinary projects, where I have offered an often innovative perspective and application of Linguistics methodologies. Among the latest researches I have focussed on the analysis of Far-Right propaganda on social media; on radicalisation narratives in Islamic extremist groups online magazines; on how trust is created in online crypto-drug markets; on big data analysis for the purpose of analysing how information is spread - across Twitter - by those users who are regarded as the “most influential” ones on a range of topics; and on the analysis of cognitive processes (Cognitive Resonance, Entrenchment Inhibition) involved in language creativity. As part of these projects I contributed to the design of the research in terms of both data collection and processing as well as data analysis, creating tools and investigating linguistic frameworks to fulfil the aims of the researches. Central to my work is in fact the development of novel approaches to the analysis of language, based on the exploration of the relationship between practical and theoretical aspects involved in Corpus Linguistics methodologies. From 2019 to 2022 I worked as linguist and project manager at the EdTech centre FEM (Future Education Modena), where I gained extensive experience in using corpus and cognitive linguistics for educational purposes. In 2018 I co-founded AFor, a multidisciplinary project on the collection and analysis of collective memories pertaining local territories.
